

ATTENTION ALL FORMER HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS OF MCINTOSH COUNTY ACADEMY: HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION TESTS ARE NO LONGER REQUIRED TO RECEIVE A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

Governor Nathan Deal signed House Bill 91 into Law on March 30, 2015 that: provides that students shall no longer be required to earn a passing score on any graduation tests to earn a high school diploma.

Students no longer enrolled on or after July 1981, can now PETITION the McIntosh County Board of Education for a diploma. Therefore, if a student earned all of their credits, but failed to graduate due to not passing either the High School Graduation Test and/or the High School Writing Test since July 1981, you may now complete a PETITION form

and submit it to McIntosh County Academy.
